1. **The NOFA for the latest round of Brownfield grants refers specifically to costs associated with "...soil, groundwater and infrastructure investigation..." In the case of a brownfield site in an area without public sewer lines, could some of the funding be spent on investigation of soil capacity to handle a new/expanded on-site wastewater system? Given that in many cases, redevelopment success for a brownfield site involve not only the removal of contamination but the installation of appropriate wastewater systems, this could be a tremendously valuable service for these grant funds. Is that use of funds possible?**
 - Yes, such an investigation is an acceptable use of funds. However, brownfield funding could not be used to design/construct such infrastructure.
